Spelling Tips

Studying spelling words can be fun! Try some of the ideas below to motivate your child to practice their spelling words at home.

Rainbow Words- Write your words using different colored markers.

Backwards Words- Write your words forwards, then backwards.

Story Words- Write a story using all your spelling words.

Scrambled Words- Write your words on a piece of paper. Cut them apart, scramble them up, then put them back together!

Ransom Words- Write your words by cutting out letters in a newspaper or magazine and glue them onto a piece of paper.

And finally, practice, practice, practice the sentence at the bottom of the spelling test! It counts as four points on the test. Students must have correct spelling, punctuation, capitalization and finger spaces!
